- The 2023 SHOT and UKTLC laboratory culture survey aimed to measure and understand the safety culture in laboratories in hospitals and blood services in the UK with input from the MHRA haemovigilance team. - The survey identified issues with safety culture prevalent in the transfusion laboratories across UK
 with staff not feeling safe to raise concerns, experiencing incivility with negative impact on their
 mental health and ability to perform their roles. Incivility in the workplace has shown to have
 negative impact on performance, communication and learning with great potential to reduce
 patient safety. In contrast, civility embedded into a restorative culture can reduce errors, stress, fear
 of blame or reprimand as well as promoting excellence
- The suggestions provided in this document are tangible ideas and examples of improvement activities already implemented in healthcare organisations demonstrating a positive impact on the safety culture. They are shared here to increase awareness and signpost tools to help create a safe space to for staff to speak up
